NT Sports to host mini tennis meet

MUSCAT: NT Sports, in cooperation with Oman Tennis Association (OTA), will organise a mini tennis tournament at the newly-built Tennis Center at The Wave, Muscat from Saturday.

The details of the tournament were revealed during a ceremony organised in the presence of OTA Executive Director Salman Al Balushi and Jurgen De Vyt, CEO of Al Batinah Power Equipment, who are the main sponsors of the tournament.

Mini tennis on April 11

A mini tennis tournament, organised by the International Tennis Academy (ITA), will be played at The Wave Tennis Centre starting on April 11. Supported by the Oman Tennis Association (OTA), the initiative is part of a long-term plan of launching a scouting and

grooming programme aimed at producing Oman's future Olympic tennis star.

The April 11 competition will involve 40 players in the age group of five to eight years. The top eight finishers from the meet will be selected for a final round, which will be held on April 25 at the same venue.

The details were announced at a press meet on Tuesday that was attended by Georgian player-turned-coach Alex Tvaliashvili, who runs the ITA, Salman al Balushi, executive director of the OTA, and Jurgen de Vyt, the CEO of Al Batinah Power, which is the equipment sponsor.
